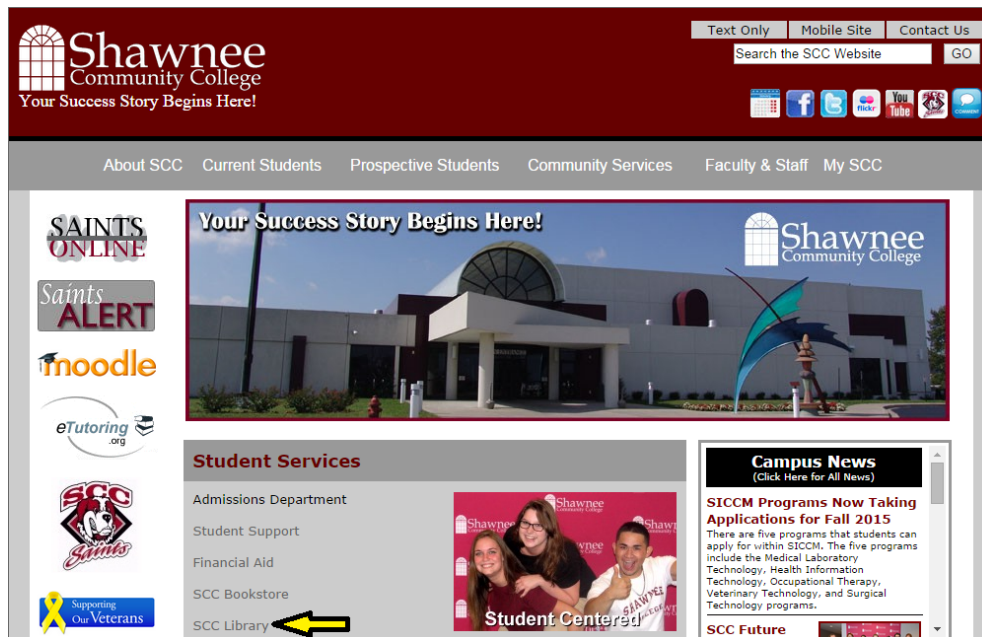


Accessing Databases When Not on Campus

If you are already on the Online Databases and Other Resources webpage, skip to step 3.

1. Go to the Shawnee Community College website at www.shawneecc.edu and click “SCC Library” in the Student Services section **OR** go directly to the SCC Library’s webpage at www.shawneecc.edu/library/.



2. Find and click the “Online Databases and Periodicals Access” link in the gray bar on the left side of the page.



3. When you reach the “Online Databases and Other Resources” webpage, click “Off-Campus Access.”

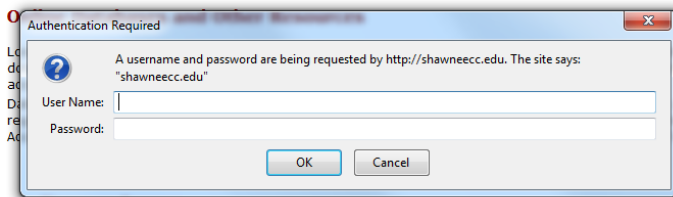
On-Campus Access

If you are on Shawnee Community College’s **main campus** in Ullin, choose On-Campus Access to use our online databases and periodical resources.

Off-Campus Access

If you are **not** on SCC main campus, choose Off-Campus Access to use our online databases and periodical resources. Log-in information for Off-Campus Access can be obtained from library staff at the library’s circulation desk, or from an instructor.

- A login box will pop up, requiring a username and password. The login information can be obtained from library staff or from your instructor. **Remember to put "scc\" in front of the username.** For example, if the username is "FallSemester", type in "scc\FallSemester". It uses a back-slash, which is between the Backspace key and the Enter key found near the middle of most keyboards.

On-Campus Access

Off-Campus Access

If you are **not** on SCC main campus, choose Off-Campus Access to use our online databases and periodical resources. Log-in information for Off-Campus Access can be obtained from library staff at the library's circulation desk, or from an instructor.

- After inputting the correct username and password, click OK. You will be redirected to the Off-Campus databases. The top of the page should state something similar to **"Log-in Successful! You May Begin Your Research Session!"**

Online Databases (Off Campus Use)

Look in these databases for magazine and journal articles. Most databases have full text articles online; others have citations or abstracts which you can use to find a paper copy in the library or borrow from other libraries. Anyone may access all databases from the main campus library computers. Databases marked Free Access may be accessed by anyone from any computer with internet access. Currently registered SCC students may access databases from off-campus by logging in to the off-campus research link using the current semester's username and password, which can be obtained from the library staff or instructors.

American History Online

American History Online offers award-winning subject entries, biographies, primary sources, images and videos, maps and charts, and timelines spanning 500 years of political, military, social, and cultural history.



Black Thought and Culture

Black Thought & Culture contains over 1,300 sources with over 1,200 authors, covering the non-fiction published works of leading African Americans. It provides around 100,000 pages of monographs, essays, articles, speeches, and interviews written by leaders within the black community from the earliest times to the present. The collection is intended for research in black studies, political science, American history, music, literature, and art. The collection begins with the works of Frederick Douglass and is targeted to include the works of W.E.B. Du Bois, Booker T. Washington, Langston Hughes, Malcolm X, Martin Luther King, Jr., Thurgood Marshall, Jesse Jackson, and many others.
