PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Community Engagement

The president, staff, administrators, faculty and Board of Trustees welcomed the community, elected officials and business members to the opening of Shawnee's Cairo Extension Center. The Cairo center's focus on technology, logistics, training, transportation, law enforcement, and other high demand areas will increase enrollment and access to residents of Alexander County and the surrounding regions in Wickliffe, Kentucky and Charleston, Missouri.

On January 17th, Shawnee will open the Vienna Extension Center. This center will expand the student base beyond the high school and provide greater access for the residents of Vienna, Goreville and surrounding communities. Superintendent Josh Stafford has been heavily involved with the planning of the Open House.

The president was nominated to serve on the Illinois Press Foundation Board which has representatives throughout the state of Illinois. The Board offers scholarships and internships for high school students and college students. The Board also provide opportunities for the public to learn about issues facing higher education and Illinois residents.

Academics

Shawnee has expanded articulation agreements with Southern Illinois University-Carbondale Fashion Department. Thank you, Dean Kristen Shelby and Instructor/Recruiter of Fashion Designs Merchandising and Styling Shelby Adkinson of SIU-Carbondale for making this happen. This expansion was the result of a survey of our students and student conversations regarding their interest in this collaboration. This 3 + 1 is the beginning of educational and employment opportunities in fashion merchandising, design and other fashion related fields.

The president participated as a panel member of Governor-Elect J.B. Pritzker 's roundtable discussion about vocational education and training in Southern Illinois. The president discussed how Shawnee is poised to help with the revitalization of career/technical education, apprenticeship program development, and employment opportunities in Southern Illinois. With direction from the Board of Trustees, Shawnee will determine community interests and aspirations and explore possible legislative agenda.

The Illinois Board of Higher Education approved the college's Apprenticeship Construction Laborer's AAS degree.

Training

Students, staff, faculty, and administrators participated in the beginning training for diversity/inclusion with Nathan Stephens, Director of the Bruce D. Nesbitt African American

Cultural Center at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Training will continue in this area as well as others.

The three vice presidents attended statewide conference meetings in their respective areas to stay abreast of crucial training issues in Illinois.

Foundation

The Saints Foundation received \$7,200.00 additional dollars from The Claire Gunn-Weaver Scholarship Fund to distribute to female students who are eligible.

To the Information Technology department, Learning Resource Center, and Maintenance Department for their work at the Cairo Extension Center. A special thank you to Chris Clark, Russ Stoup, Don Koch, Tiffany Ryan, Robb Betts, and Leslie Weldon. State Payment Update

The state owes a total of \$126,052 for base operating grant for November and December, \$747,159 for equalization grant for October, November and December. This is a total of \$873,211 owed to Shawnee Community College by the State of Illinois.

Facilities Update

The college began the Quality Based Selection (QBS) process for architectural services by advertising Request For Qualifications (RFQ). The RFQs were due on November 13, 2018. On November 15, 2018, the committee met to select the architects, which will move to the next step of the process (presentations/interviews). All five architects that submitted proposals moved to the next step. All five firms did make a presentation to the committee. Presentations/Interviews were conducted the week of December 3, 2018. Due to the holiday schedule and the open house for Cairo, the final recommendation will come to the board at the February board meeting.

Instructional Technology Department

The Instructional Technology Department worked with IT to setup the new Cairo Center. This will mark the first time that we have had three ITV rooms at Cairo. Prior to this semester there has been only one. The three rooms allowed an extensive schedule to be offered for the spring semester. The spring semester will be one of the busiest semesters ever for ITV. More classrooms and more courses will be offered. Shawnee remains a leader in interactive video.

Library

SCC's library is a member of the Consortium of Academic and Research Libraries, or CARLI. CARLI provides discounts for some products and services. Included in those are the CINAHL (nursing), NexisUni, and Oxford English Dictionary databases. For every dollar SCC invested in electronic databases through CARLI in FY 2018, the return on investment is estimated at \$3.29. Overall, for all services and products, SCC had a return of \$4.51 for every dollar invested. Tracey Johnson, librarian, continues to work with CARLI, other consortia, and with database providers directly to get the lowest cost possible for electronic resources.

Use of the library as a place to study or read is increasing. Study table and small study room users were counted throughout the day, without duplicating counts, so that each individual was counted only once per day. Weekly totals do include duplicated headcounts, reflecting people who used the library on multiple days. Usage counts include students who were reading in the library as part of a class and college staff who used rooms for meetings. On average, 170 people per month sat at tables or study carrels and 65 people per month used a study room.

Anna Center

During the Month of December, the Anna Extension Center has had community events such as: A CPR course was taught on December 4th, SEMO's transfer representative setup a transfer information table in the lobby on December 5th, Man Power hosted a job fair in the Anna Center conference room, a Driver Safety course was held on Saturday, December 15th, and the Union County CEO program had their board meeting in the conference room on December 18th.

Metro Center

The Metro Center is preparing for the spring semester and will have a Welcome Back popcorn for students on January 15th and 16th. Two Metro Center class truck driving students from the fall 2018 semester passed the CDL (Commercial Driver's License) test.

Cairo Center

The Cairo Center is in the process of registering students for Spring 2019. Most of the current students will be taking classes at the Center in the Spring. The schedule for the Spring Semester is solid and will serve our community well.

RETENTION

Financial Aid

The Financial Aid Office has awarded \$1,132,143.43 in Pell grants to 479 students. We have not awarded any other financial aid as we have not received the MAP funds. However, we anticipate receiving those funds in the coming weeks. In addition, the department held FAFSA completion events for Student Support Services (SSS) students on November 7 and November 15.

Student Success Center

<u>Tutoring</u>: One hundred-four requests for tutoring were submitted.

<u>Testing Lab</u>: There were 123 exams administered (6 ACCUPLACER, 6 CNA State Certification exam, 2 Distance Learning exam, 96 make-up exams, 1 Workkeys exam and 12 Pearson Vue exams).

<u>Retention Alert</u>: There are currently 183 student retention cases open. Faculty and advisors work in collaboration to bridge students to resources; both internal and external to promote student success. Case categories range from attendance, classroom, financial and personal issues.


