Application Process

1. Apply to School in person, by mail or online.
2. Official Transcripts of all high school and College Credits is Required for Registrar's Office
3. Testing (Entrance Exam)
4. Complete Financial Aid FASFA
5. Transcript (Official to Registrar)

Proving Residency

Applicants are asked to prove residency when applying to the college. You may do so either by a **voter registration card, property taxes, or drivers license by February 14th in the records office.**

Entrance Exam (TEAS EXAM)

Shawnee Community College Testing Center

- Each applicant may take the Entrance test twice between October 1, 2020 and March 1, 2021 for PN applicants and between October 1, 2020 and April 1, 2021 for ADN applicants.
- The cost of the test is \$90.00
- Schedule the entrance test through the Shawnee College Testing Center by email **testing@shawnecc.edu**. Please pay for TEAs Exam at the SCC Bursar's Office. You must have receipt for payment and photo ID in order to take the exam.
- Upon taking the test the applicant will be given results. Bring the test scores down, after testing, to the Nursing Department for them to be copied.
- Test scores are good for two years

*Practical Nursing/Associate Degree Nursing Entrance Exam Instructions

- Please schedule an appointment with the Shawnee Community College Testing Center. Please email testing@shawneecc.edu.
- Log onto www.atitesting.com and click Create an Account. Designate a username and password.
- It will ask you what school, if LPN choose **Shawnee TEAS PN**, if RN you will choose **Shawnee TEAS ADN**.
- Pay the \$90.00 fee at the Bursar's office the day of exam. Please bring the receipt with you.

These Items will be needed to begin the test:

- *Photo ID*
- *Receipt from Bursar*
- *Username and password you obtained through the website*

Once the test is complete, submit test results along with your application to the Shawnee Community College Nursing Department. If you should have any questions please contact them at **618-634-3282**.

* If you should lose your results, you may log back into your ATI account and click on the **MY RESULTS** tab to re-print them.

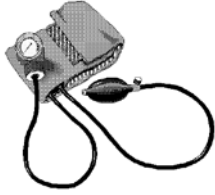

Thank you for your interest in the Associate Degree Nursing Program at Shawnee Community College. The College has an Open Door Admission Policy, however, there are some programs which have admission requirements. You will find the admission requirements for the Associate Degree Nursing Program on the second page of this packet. **Please read through the information carefully.**

Admission into the Associate Degree Nursing Program is based on the composite score of the required entrance test and points awarded for excelling in designated science classes. Student's admission to the Associate Degree Nursing program is conditional pending successful completion of an approved school of Practical Nursing program and the Nursing Orientation/Skill Review Course (ADN 201). This process is explained in the packet. All General Education and pre-requisite classes are required to be complete before starting the Associate Degree Nursing program.

Admission Requirements

The following procedures will apply to all prospective students seeking admission to Shawnee Community College Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) Program. Failure to comply with the deadline dates designated by the College will terminate the application for the class in which the applicant is seeking admission; and it will be the responsibility of the applicant to inform the Nursing Department if he/she wishes to be considered for admission to a future class. **Test scores are good for two years; however, a new application must be completed each year and submitted by the required deadline.**

- A) All application materials must be delivered to the Nursing Department by April 1, 2021.
The required application materials include: a completed Associate Degree Nursing Application Form found in this packet, Practical Nursing transcript (if not a Shawnee Community College graduate) and an unencumbered LPN license is required after the by the end of the fall semester in order to continue in the ADN program, unofficial college transcript if applicable, degree audit, picture ID and TEAS test scores. If not a Shawnee Community college student, please complete the entire Shawnee Community College application for admission. For the Degree Section, mark Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing.
- B) Follow the procedure for taking the Pre-Admission Examination as listed on the next page.
- C) Students are rank-ordered for admission. **Preference is given to in-district applicants.** All out-of-district applicants are rank-ordered at the bottom of the in-district list.
- D) Points will be added to the Adjusted Individual Total Score (providing you have made at least a 60% on TEAs Exam) for completion of **BIO 215, Introduction to Physiology; and BIO 218, Microbiology.** Points will be given as follows: A = 3 points, B = 2 points. These points will be counted only at the time of the class selection in April. Classes completed after that time will not count as points toward admission. **An accumulative GPA of 2.5 is required.**
- E) A TEAS score of 60 or greater is required.
- F) When ranking students, if a tie occurs the TEAS reading score will be used as the tie breaker.
- G) The nursing class will be selected by the end of April and notification letters will be mailed no later May 15th. If you have not received a letter from the college Nursing Department by May 31th, please contact the Nursing Department at (618) 634-3282.
- H) **Student's admission to the ADN program is conditional pending successful completion of an approved school of Practical Nursing, successful completion of NCLEX and an unencumbered LPN license by December final exams.**
- I) Students accepted into the program must submit a completed Shawnee Community College Physical Form that demonstrates physical capabilities to perform all clinical work expected of a student nurse. (The physical form is not required until an acceptance letter into the program is received. The physical form will be provided upon acceptance to the nursing program.) All requested/required information must be completed and turned in no later than August 1, 2021.
- J) Students must submit to a criminal background check and drug test after being accepted into the program at student expense.
- K) Students must provide proof of personal health insurance or a medical card, current physical exam and immunization records one-week prior the first day of nursing orientation.
- L) Failure to comply with **all** deadline dates designated by the College WILL terminate the application for the class in which the applicant is seeking admission
- M) Applicants who are not admitted or failed to comply with required deadlines will not be carried over for the next year. If interested in applying for the next year's program, a new application must be submitted.
- N) Students must provide a copy of American Heart Association BLS Healthcare Provider CPR card that is current throughout the length of the ADN program. Contact the nursing department if a CPR class is needed.

Associate Degree Nursing Entrance Test Procedure

The test given for entry into the Shawnee Community College Associate Degree Nursing program is the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) from the Assessment Technologies Institute, LLC (ATI).

Applicants wishing to prepare for the test can purchase the TEAS Study Manual Sixth Edition or access to online practice tests. A combination package of the study manual and online access is also available. Please note that these products are optional. If you are interested in purchasing any of the items go to www.atitesting.com and click on Online Store for more information.

1. Each applicant may take the entrance test twice between October 1, 2020 and April 1, 2021. Any additional tests beyond the first two will not be counted. The highest composite score of the two tests will be accepted. Two weeks between the tests are required. The entrance test must be taken at the Shawnee Community College Testing Center. Exceptions may be allowed by the Director of Nursing based on extenuating circumstances. **A TEAS score of 60 or greater is required.**
2. The cost of the test is \$90.00 each time it is taken.
3. The applicant should schedule the entrance test through the Shawnee College Testing Center by sending an email to **testing@shawneecc.edu**. The test is administered via the computers in the Testing Center. All efforts will be made to accommodate the student in regard to scheduling, however due to the high usage of the testing center it is recommended that individuals schedule a testing time well in advance. You must have your receipt for payment and photo ID in order to take the exam **(No exceptions)**. Payment is to be made at the Bursar's Office and a receipt for payment will be given to the payee.
4. Upon taking the test the applicant will be given a photocopy of the test results. The original copy of the test results will stay with the testing coordinator. **Please bring your test scores down, after testing, to the Nursing Department to be copied and put in the computer.**
5. Test scores are good for two years. However, students must complete a new application form for each year and submit it by the required deadline.
6. The applicant must pay the fee for testing before or on the day of testing.
7. The last date for test scores and applications to be accepted for the 2020/2021 academic year is April 1, 2021.

FACT SHEET
POTENTIAL ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING STUDENTS

1. The student will need to provide your own transportation to and from the campus and to and from your assigned clinic site. The clinic sites currently in use are located in Cape Girardeau, MO, Paducah, KY, Carbondale, IL and Marion, IL.
2. Potential Associate Degree Nursing students should not purchase anything until after they have attended an orientation and registration session which is scheduled in the spring and summer of the admission year.
3. The **approximate** cost for the total program is \$7519. This cost includes tuition, fees, textbooks, uniforms, equipment and licensure application.

The Associate Degree Nursing Program has been chosen as a targeted program for the Perkins Grant. This Federal Vocational Grant supplies supplemental services such as tutoring, adaptive equipment, supplies, etc. for students who would qualify as academically challenged, physically handicapped, economically disadvantaged, LEP (Limited English Proficient), and non-traditional (male) students. Information on this program will be provided during orientation.

Shawnee Community College is an equal opportunity affirmative action institution.
