Scholarship Information

Applying for Saints Awards & Saints Foundation Scholarships

- Complete the online Saints Award and Scholarship Application at https://shawneecc.academicworks.com
- 2. First-time users: Send an email immediately to scholarships@shawneecc.edu with the student's name and email address to use to complete the online scholarship application. The Financial Aid Office will respond back when log in is available. When creating the password, do not use any part of the email address (and follow all the requirements given). After the password is set up, click on "Sign Up" at the top right of the online application screen.
- 3. <u>Returning users</u>: Click on "Sign In" at the top right of the online application screen, if email and password have already been set up.
- Read each description CAREFULLY and select any for which you meet all qualifications.
- 5. Submit a high school, GED, or college transcript, dependent on student education level.
- 6. Upload any required attachments directly through the online application.
- 7. Shawnee Community College in-district students will be given priority.

Requirements for Recipients

- 1. Must complete a 2023-2024 FAFSA.
- 2. Saints Awards & Saints Foundation Scholarships must be initiated by the fall semester after receiving award.
- 3. Must attend the fall semester following the award, cannot receive an award/scholarship at SCC if only attending the summer semester following the award.
- 4. Must enroll at SCC in an AA, AS, AAS, or certificate program of study.
- Must not be enrolled as a full-time student at another college.
- Meet the requirements to keep the award/scholarship for the next semester.
- 7. Students must maintain a 2.5 Cumulative GPA unless otherwise noted. GPA will be checked from semester to semester. GPA requirements are based on a 4.00 grading scale.
- 8. Students must remain in good standing as determined by the college.
- 9. Must pay any outstanding debts owed to the college.
- 10. <u>Must be continuously enrolled with no break in</u> attendance.

Information in this booklet is subject to change without notice. All scholarships are pending funding availability.

Offer Letter

Once an award/scholarship is awarded, the student must immediately designate in writing if they choose to decline the award/scholarship by the deadline date on the offer letter. Once the recipient declines the scholarship, it may no longer be available.

Failure to Meet Requirements

Shawnee Community College (SCC) reserves the right to alter or cancel individual scholarships at any time for failure to meet the requirements. When one of the stated standards is not met, the student will lose the scholarship. Once a student has lost an SCC scholarship for any reason, it cannot be resumed at a later date unless extenuating circumstances can be proven through a processed appeal. The student is responsible for making sure all requirements are met.

GENERAL FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

FULL-TIME STUDENT or PART-TIME STUDENT

A full-time student is one who is enrolled in12 or more credit hours during the fall and spring semesters. A part-time student is one who is enrolled in less than 12 credit hours during the fall and spring semesters.

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

The first step is to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). With this form, students automatically apply for a Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Work-Study, and MAP (Illinois residents). The FAFSA must also be completed when applying for scholarships.

The FAFSA must be filled out each academic year. Application can begin on October 1 for the upcoming fall semester. The FAFSA is available online at http://www.fafsa.gov. Shawnee Community College's School Code is 007693.

Federal and state grants are based on family need. Financial need is the difference between the cost of attending SCC for one year and the amount a family can expect to pay. For financial aid purposes, the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is based on the information submitted on the FAFSA.

After Submitting The FAFSA

After submitting the FAFSA, the student will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR) notification through email. The SAR provides Federal Pell Grant eligibility information. Students should review the SAR carefully for any missing information or errors and make corrections, if needed, by accessing www.fafsa.gov.

TYPES of AWARDS

Saints Foundation Scholarships

Shawnee Community College SAINTS Foundation scholarships are made possible by supportive individuals, families, alumni, community businesses and organizations, as well as through employee giving. Some Foundation scholarships are awarded based on various criteria established by the donor.

Federal Pell Grant

The Pell Grant is the basis for all federal financial aid and is awarded to students who have financial need and meet federal eligibility requirements. Pell Grants may range up to \$6,895 per year (these numbers may change slightly each year).

Pell Grants are based upon the number of eligible credit hours a student is enrolled in by semester. Half of the annual Pell amount will be disbursed in the fall semester and the other half will be disbursed in the spring semester. Summer Pell may be available.

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)

FSEOGs are awarded to students who have the greatest financial need and apply early. Amounts vary based on annual funding levels.

Monetary Award Program (MAP)

The Monetary Award Program (MAP) grant is a state-funded grant that is awarded to eligible students. It is based on the Expected Family Contribution (EFC), which is determined by the information reported on the FAFSA. Students (parents, if dependent) must meet Illinois residency requirements and be enrolled in at least three credit hours. The MAP grant will pay a portion of the tuition at the SCC in-district rate.

Federal and Institutional Work Study

The Work Study program gives students an opportunity to earn money while gaining valuable work experience. Students should contact the Financial Aid Office to apply for open jobs.

Satisfactory Academic Progress

Students must be making Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) toward a degree to keep federal or state financial aid. The SAP Policy is available in the college catalog.
