

Consolidation of Formal Complaints



A recipient may consolidate formal complaints as to allegations of sexual harassment against more than one respondent, or by more than one complainant against one or more respondents, or by one party against the other party, where the allegations of sexual harassment arise out of the same facts or circumstances.

























Case Study: Patterns

During an investigation alleging nonconsensual sexual contact, a witness states that the respondent also inappropriately touched them. They provide you with additional names of people who have also been touched by the respondent.

Case Study: Intersecting Policies

A complainant reports that they have been subjected to harassing comments based on both their gender identity as well as their race.

Case Study: Intersecting Policies 2

A complainant reports that they experienced non-consensual sexual assault on-campus. Later in the evening, they experienced non-consensual sexual penetration off-campus. Both incidents involve the same respondent, complainant, and witnesses.

Case Study: Cross Claims

The complainant reports an incapacitated sexual assault—he states he was too drunk to consent but does have memories of the night. The respondent states that he was blacked out and has no memories of the night.

Case Study: Faculty

Two students have filed formal complaints that their professor consistently makes sexually inappropriate comments in class and via email. One student has indicated that she just wants the behaviors to stop and is unsure if she will participate in any investigation.

Case Study: Are They The Same?

Two students have filed formal complaints against the same respondent. One complainant alleges sexual assault. The other complainant alleges stalking and dating violence.

Case Study: The Hearing

You have just completed a consolidated investigation regarding two complainants who allege separate incidences of stalking against the same respondent. The case is ready to proceed to a hearing.

Case Study: The Hearing 2

You have just completed a consolidated investigation regarding multiple complainants involving the same respondent. All of the claims involved sexual harassment (both verbal and unwelcome hugging, backrubs, kissing). Two of the complainants experienced all of the behaviors as outlined. Three others experienced only verbal harassment. One experienced unwelcomed backrubs and kissing.
